THE CHALLENGE

DAY 1

Fly from London to Lusaka.

DAY 2

Arrive in Lusaka and transfer to Maziba Farm in Kalomo, your base for the next four nights.

DAYS 3 TO 5

Embark on 3 full days of project work, assisting the local communities.

DAY 6

Transfer to Livingstone, home of the mighty Victoria Falls.

DAY 7

A well-deserved free day to enjoy the Falls and perhaps take part in a further challenge such as white-water rafting, abseiling or a bungee jump!

DAY 8

Transfer to the magnificent Lower Zambezi River Valley complete with wild elephants, lions and hippos, to embark on your canoeing safari. After paddling a short distance downstream, set up camp on a deserted island for a night under the stars!

DAYS 9 & 10

Continue canoeing, spotting wild animals as you go. Set up camp each night on the river banks.

DAY 11

Finish canoeing and this afternoon return to Lusaka for a farewell dinner.

DAY 12

Transfer to the airport for the return flight to London.
